Getting Involved

Hosting an event

All members are encouraged to host MOMS Club events as often as they like. It is very easy! Once you have chosen an activity, playgroup, or field trip, simply contact our calendar coordinator. She will put your event on the calendar and make sure everyone gets an email reminder a few days before. Members will be asked to RSVP 24 hours in advance, so you'll have an idea who's coming.

Ideas for events: Playgroups, lunches, nature walks, shopping trips, museums, playscapes, kids crafts, breakfasts and discussion groups.

MOMS Night Out is our once a month night for Moms only! This is a really fun and easy event to host, and we are always looking for new ideas. It's more fun when a different person hosts MOMS Night out each month!

Each member of the MOMS Club is asked to serve on at least one committee.

Committees

Sunshine Committee

Plans social events like holiday parties and also keeps an eye out for the welfare of our members. We prepare meals for new moms, and send cards to members who are sick or grieving. This committee is perfect for people who like to plan and organize things. The more, the merrier!

Membership Committee

Works to recruit new members to the club. This is a great way to meet new people and make our club better! Committee members work on publicity, promoting membership to the community, coordinating hospitality at meetings and sponsoring the Big Sister program.

Community Service Committee

Plans and orchestrates at least one service project each year to benefit the mothers and children in our community. Previous projects have included a food drive and adopting a family for the holidays. New committee members are welcome at any time!

Open House Committee

Coordinates the biannual open houses for the purpose of recruiting and welcoming prospective members. This is also a great way to meet people and plan a fun event. The chairperson would work with the committee to choose a date and location for the open houses, organize the potluck refreshments and publicize the event.

Coordinator positions

Website Coordinator

This just keeps the board members and phone numbers current. The website is all set up, so only that small data entry is needed annually and the bill needs to be paid, which is of course submitted to our budget and reimbursed.

Big Sister Coordinator

This person matches up a "Big Sister" to new club members. The Big Sister invites the new members to play dates, and is there to answer any questions the new member may have for the first few months.

Craft Coordinator

This person submits a monthly craft to the newsletter and brings a craft to the Monthly All Member Meeting.

Guest Speaker Coordinator

This person sets up guest speakers for the All Member Meetings.

Newspaper Article Coordinator

This person submits the monthly All-Member Meeting announcement as well as any various public relations articles as needed to the RiverEast.

Sunshine Committee Guidelines

A MOMS Club member is welcome to call upon the Sunshine Committee whenever she feels she could benefit from some assistance. Situations may include bed rest during pregnancy, the birth or adoption of a child, a death in the family, an extended illness or surgery, moving, etc. The amount of assistance will vary depending on the situation.

Requesting help: All MOMS Club members are eligible for help from the Sunshine Committee. We have a help request form that can be filled out to provide the committee with information to use in scheduling and providing help. This form can be picked up from the Sunshine Committee Coordinator.

Since we realize that when most of us need help is also when we are least likely to ask for it, please notify the committee if you think another member would benefit from some help.

The following guidelines have been written mostly with meals in mind, but they can apply somewhat to all situations. If both the person asking for help and the person providing it know what to expect it should go more smoothly for all involved.

- 1. Call ahead. Please call the person you are cooking a meal for by noon of the day you are providing it to tell her when you will be dropping it off and what it includes. Please let the other mom know whether you have prepared and entire meal (entrée, side dish, dessert) or just the entrée, so she can begin preparing the remainder if needed.
- 2. Disposable Containers. Please use disposable containers (foil pans, baggies, etc) whenever possible so that the recipient doesn't have to wash them and return them. If you choose not to use disposable containers, please clearly mark all items with your name.
- 3. When possible, please provide enough food for more than one meal (leftovers).
- 4. Please don't forget! If you sign up to provide a meal, please follow through or call well enough in advance so that the family can make alternate plans. Thank you!

Thanks for helping us to support the moms in our chapter. That is what Moms Offering Moms Support is all about!

MOMS Club of Hebron Chapter Guidelines <u>Moms Offering Moms Support</u>

These Chapter Guidelines are established by the MOMS Club of Hebron to allow our members to learn, play, and grow in a healthy and safe environment. These Guidelines are in addition to and in no way violate our Chapter's Bylaws.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to establish guidelines for members at all MOMS Club functions or when interacting with other members. It will allow for the removal of members from the MOMS Club roster if they violate the Guidelines established and set forth herein. The final decision will rest with the Executive Board.

- No member shall use obscene or abusive verbal language directed toward any other member of the Club or their child/children.
- No member shall discipline another mother's child(ren) without her permission. In the event of a conflict between children, separate and notify their mothers.
- No member shall use physical or obscene gestures toward any member of the Club or their child/children.
- Members shall refrain from malicious gossip or harassment regarding other members of the Club in person, via phone or eMail.
- All members shall be considerate and respectful to the property of other members.
- Members shall not misuse the MOMS Club directory or its contents.
- Members shall abide by the e-mail policy as set forth by the International MOMS Club. Specifically, members shall not abuse member accessibility via e-mail for anything outside of MOMS Club business, unless specifically approved and accepted by each Member.
- Members shall abide by the Bylaws as set forth by the International MOMS Club. A copy of the Bylaws
 will be available in a white notebook at all monthly business meetings for review by any members in
 attendance. In addition, if desired, a member may request a copy of the Bylaws to keep for
 themselves.
- Parents and their children (if old enough) are expected to help pick up the toys before they leave a
 playgroup activity unless otherwise directed by the mom hosting the event.
- According to MOMS Club Bylaws, there is to be NO SMOKING at ALL MOMS Club activities.
- Nursing MOMS and their babies are ALWAYS welcome at ALL club activities and events.

* For the benefit of all our Members, please keep your child under control.

Mothers/guardians are responsible for the actions and safety of their own children at all times *

RSVP POLICY

Please observe and act when there is an RSVP* on the calendar for an event. It is there so the hostess knows how many people to expect and makes planning the whole activity run smoothly. If the event has an RSVP, the group will wait for 10 minutes for any member to arrive at any event of activity. After 10 minutes, the members in attendance will proceed with the event of activity as planned. If you have RSVP'd for an event and then cannot attend, please notify the RSVP hostess whenever possible.

*If you plan to bring a child other than your own to any MOMS Club function, a signed Liability Waiver from the child's parent must be given to the hostess of the activity and then given to a Executive Board Member. Any guest child will be expected to abide by all MOMS Club Guidelines and will be the sole responsibility of the adult bringing the child.

<u>WEATHER POLICY</u> Please use your own discretion for attending MOMS Club activities during inclement weather

While each of us will of course have to decide whether or not to attend any scheduled activity, we have established the following policy regarding MOMS Club events during inclement weather:

MOMS Club of Hebron Chapter Guidelines <u>Moms Offering Moms Support</u>

(WEATHER POLICY CONTINUED)

- When the Hebron Public Schools are closed due to weather, MOMS Club activities (including Playgroup) scheduled for that day will be canceled.
- If there is a delayed opening of Hebron Public Schools, any MOMS Club activity (including Playgroup) scheduled for that day will be held.
- If there is an afternoon or evening activity planned and Hebron Public Schools are let out early that day, the activity that was scheduled will also be canceled.

AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR

Consists of hair pulling, hitting, biting, kicking, spitting, wrestling, running, throwing, etc.

- When disciplining, that child's mother should remove the child from the immediate area. Please keep
 in mind that some behavior is considered "appropriate" for certain ages and not for other ages. For
 example, biting will occur more frequently in toddlers since they don't have the ability to express how
 they feel.
- If a child is consistently having behavioral problems that have warranted their removal from several
 activities, the mother maybe asked to refrain from attending events until that child's aggressive or
 anti-social behavior is under control.
- Destruction of property, urinating in public areas, and swearing is strictly prohibited. If any of these activities occurs, the above Guidelines should be followed.
- If your child damages something, valuable of not, it is your responsibility to offer to repair or replace the item.
- If a child is deemed a danger to themselves or other children on a continual basis, the mother may be asked to resign her membership in the Club.

Kids are going to be kids and situations are going to arise, so please be fair with ALL children concerned.

We all need to remember to focus on the behavior and not on the individual.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- The indoor/outdoor area in which the children play should be structurally safe (i.e., Free from any ongoing structure remodeling, free from any old and possibly dangerous structure conditions). If your home is older and has lead paint, the paint should be in good condition if the children are playing around it.
- The indoor area in which the children play should be sanitary in both appearance and odor. For instance, there should not be any excessive dirt, hair or clutter. There should neither be excessive pet odors or residual chemical odors. These can pose considerable health risks to children.
- If the children are playing outdoors, any backyard equipment must be in good working order. The ground outside should be relatively free of pet feces.
- The toys that the children will be playing with should be safe, relatively clean, and age appropriate. Also, toys that will instill a negative impact are discouraged (i.e., play guns, knives, swords).
- Children should not be allowed to stand, climb or jump on or from any furniture, stairs or railings.
 Although this may be allowed in your home, it is considered by most to be inappropriate behavior.
- All chemical products and potential hazardous items are to be stored safely out of the reach of children.
- If your family owns a firearm that is not always locked up or kept out of the reach of children, you
 MUST make sure it is safely out of reach in a locked room that children will not be allowed into during
 the MOMS Club activity in your home.
- If there are pets at a house where there is a Club activity, <u>please notify those that RSVP</u>. Dogs and cats can be very unpredictable when confronted by many small children, and therefore these pets must be put someplace where kids cannot get to them. There are also many children and adults that

- have allergies to these animals. All involved should agree whether animals could commingle at a gathering.
- A pool should be either fenced or locked at all times.
- Swimming in kiddle pools will be allowed, using no more than 5" of water; you must consider small infants.
- If your child has diarrhea they should NOT participate in any pool activities, even if they are using swim diapers, because they could contaminate the pool water with E. coli bacteria.
- Kiddie pools are to be filled with water the day of the function, due to the possibility of stagnant water leading to urinary-tract infections and open wound infections.
- Kiddie pools should always be turned over when drained to avoid the breeding of mosquitoes.
- Neither the local MOMS Club of Hebron nor the International MOMS Club Corporation is responsible
 for the actions or safety of any children or adults at any time. Parent/guardian is responsible for
 child(ren) behavior and safety.

SICK POLICY

Healthy members are important to us so please do NOT attend any MOMS Club function if you or your child/children has or had ONE of the following symptoms within the last 24 hours:

- Severe cough (that is not related to asthma or allergies)
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea or upset stomach
- Sore throat
- Evidence of lice, scables, or other parasitic infection
- Fever of 100° orally; 101° rectally

- Conjunctivitis (pink eye) with or without discharge
- Extreme lethargy
- Unusual spots or rashes
- Green or yellow mucus from nose
- Any infections in which you started an antibiotic within 24 hours or less

The above Chapter Guidelines must be enforced at all MOMS Club functions, including, but not limited to, All Member Meetings and Board Meetings, as well as any other MOMS Club sponsored Activity groups, Playgroups, and Club-wide outings.

All mothers understand that the Chapter Guidelines are put in place to protect the safety of the children in attendance, and are not meant to single out any child. Please remember to USE YOUR BEST JUDGEMENT when you are at a Club function. We all realize that children of different ages will act differently. Take this into consideration when following these Guidelines. They are not meant to allenate any MOMS or to stop anyone from attending any MOMS Club activities.
